The Freeholders have hired the last of the contractors needed for planned renovations and repairs. The electricians have started ripping out the pre-WWII wiring and the builders have started to gut some rooms in the basement in preparation for our new fancy bathrooms.

The good news, however, is that for the first time since our resuscitation as an organization 17 months ago, it appears that we can plan on the repairs being done at some particular point in the future, that point being the spring of 2000. 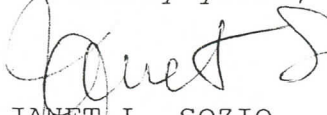
